AUGUSTA, Ga., Feb. 1 (AP)—President Eisenhower announced early today America's first satellite is in orbit around the earth.

The President's dramatic announcement was issued at his vacation headquarters a few minutes before 1 a m. EST by White House press secretary James C. Hagerty.

The satellite was launched at Cape Canaveral, Fla., at 10:58 p. m. EST, last night.

Army Reveals Second Moon Is Scheduled

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP)—The United States first man-made satellite started around the earth today and the Army disclosed it is preparing to start another one.

The launching is part of our country's participation in the International Geophysical Year. All information received from the satellite promptly will be made available to the public.
